A prayer of confession

Father eternal, giver of light and grace, we have sinned against you and against our neighbour, in what we have thought, in what we have said and done, through ignorance, through weakness, through our own deliberate fault.

We have wounded your love and marred your image in us.

We are sorry and ashamed and repent of all our sins.

For the sake of your Son Jesus Christ, who died for us, forgive us all that is past and lead us out from darkness to walk as children of light. Amen

SWEDISH STUDY METHOD



AN ARISE MINISTRIES COLLECTIVE RESOURCE

PRAY

Prayer is powerful in understanding scripture. Ask God to bring clarity and understanding as you read.

READ

Reading scripture out loud together helps focus the mind and heart.

OBSERVE + DISCUSS

Look for three things:

A LIGHT BULB //



Anything that draws attention or stands out. It can be something that strikes you particularly or is an important part of the passage.



A QUESTION MARK //

Anything that is hard to understand.

AN ARROW //



How can you apply this to your life? How is God encouraging you? Is there a sin God is revealing to you?

EXPAND

As you become more comfortable. expand your questions to include the following:

- GENRE // What type of writing Is this? Narrative? Poetry? Wisdom Literature? A Parable?
- MAIN IDEA // What is the central idea the author was trying to get his audience to understand? Look at repeated words and phrases. How is the plot developing?
- · CONTEXT // What happened before and after the passage? What is the historical context? What would the original audience have seen or experienced?
- CHARACTER DEVELOPMENT // Has a character grown? Changed in some way? Is there a sin revealed?
- GOD'S CHARACTER // What does this passage reveal about
- . GOSPEL CONNECTION // How does this passage reveal the Gospel - Namely how is God working towards the redemption of humanity? Does it hint at Jesus and the cross in some way?
