Our theme this Advent is found in three words: watching, waiting, anticipating. Each of these words encapsulate the idea of looking into the future with the expectation that something is going to happen. It is about learning to inhabit the "not yet". As Suzanne, William and I were counting down to the due date, we inhabited this space. We knew what would happen but not when it would happen, and so we waited: watching and anticipating. We were not passive,



however, there were various jobs that needed doing as we awaited the new arrival. Our time of waiting was a time of preparing, getting ready to meet someone new.

Advent is also a season of preparation. It is thought that the season of Advent developed from a six-week period of preparation by those who were being baptized on Epiphany, celebrated on 6th January. Although Advent has now lost this baptismal focus, it nevertheless remains a season to invest our time in our relationship with God. Advent is a time to prepare to grow as we commit to our own spiritual growth and seek to deepen our relationship with God. Advent is a time for preparing, getting ready to meet Jesus anew.

To help you with this we're linking in with the "Lights in the Darkness" course that has been put together by the Diocese of Sheffield. I'd encourage you to work through it, and invite a few friends to join in with you. In January our next Alpha course will be starting, may I encourage you to think of five people that you could invite to try Alpha and pray for them during Advent, asking for an opportunity to invite them and that they will say "Yes". Finally, if you turn to the back of this newsletter you will discover some special services that I have planned for next year. Pop them into your diary and have a think about who you could invite along. As we step into an Advent and Christmas unlike any before, let us *prepare to grow* as we seek to renew our relationship with Jesus and take steps to introduce him to others.

Advent Reflection

The season of Advent has been described as the most beautiful and profound time of the Christian year, yet this can also be a time of great stress. For some, frantic preparation leads to exhaustion and frustration. For others it can be a time of deep sadness and regret, a time of feeling helpless and afraid.

In this time of uncertainty, we are hopeful that we may be able to spend

a little time with loved ones over Christmas but recognise that restrictions may still be in place. Advent 2020 will be different from past years, with different challenges and opportunities. However, one thing is certain ... *God is with us,* whatever our circumstances, as we journey together. Remember that God is everywhere, all around us, constantly reaching out to us, even in the most unlikely situations.

During the first lockdown, many of us spoke of being uplifted by being out in the garden, walking in the park, or simply enjoying the view from a window. It is good to take time to see what might otherwise remain unnoticed, the signs of God's presence in the world, in the people we meet and in our own lives too. The signs are there if we open our eyes!

Henri Nouwen spoke of Advent as "an active waiting in which we live the present moment to the full in order to find there the signs of the One we are waiting for."

As the first door on the Advent calendar is opened, some young members of our family, and others not so young, will tell us that we have 26 sleeps till Christmas Day! Waiting for Christmas is part of the excitement.

Advent is an exciting time to come afresh - or even for the first time – to God's word, because it is a time of new beginnings. With Mary and Joseph and all creation we wait expectantly for a birth. Every birthday can be a time of reflection, wonder and hope, but surrounding *this* birthday is a simply breath-catching expectancy, for it celebrates the birth of God's Son, the Word made flesh. Emmanuel, God with us.





Seeking to build on the success of #FollowTheStar the Church of England has launched a new campaign: **Comfort and Joy**. It seeks to reflect the hope that Christmas will bring both joy and celebration after a uniquely difficult year as a result of the pandemic. At the same it recognises that many of us still long for comfort in the face of the hardship and loss we have endured this year, be that the loss of livelihoods or loved ones.

This series of short reflections seeks to help us navigate a difficult Christmas season by exploring the themes of comfort and joy. It shall be based on the structure of the traditional carol service of Nine Lessons and Carols and as such it will explore the biblical texts associated with Christmas as well as and the words of much-loved Christmas carols. These reflections shall cover every day from Christmas Day up until the 2nd January. They will also be made available freely via audio, smart speaker, as well as via app and email formats with accompanying prayer activities for children and families. Alpha provides you with the chance to ask the big questions in life and to share what you think with a small group of people just like you. Each session looks at a different question around faith and is designed to


create conversation. No matter who you are Alpha is for you! It's fun, relaxed, and there's no pressure.
